UPDATES FROM SELF.M.AID

As a former volunteer at the SKILLS FACTORY and now newly elected co-president, I am pleased to address our remarkable selfm.aid community in this newsletter.

In the past year, selfm.aid and the SKILLS FACTORY have undergone numerous changes. These changes have impacted the Swiss board and the situation at the SKILLS FACTORY in Samos. Change is not always easy and can be daunting, but we all see it as an opportunity to mobilize transformative energy to help selfm.aid flourish even more.

Since our last update in November, the SKILLS FACTORY has relocated to a new building and reopened as SKILLS FACTORY 2.0 in March 2024. While the core concept of the SKILLS FACTORY remains unchanged due to its proven effectiveness, the 2.0 version focuses more on quality than quantity and offers better facilities. This new version emphasizes training, production, and networking. Additionally, we are increasing the permanent staff on the ground. It is a place where people are seen, valued, appreciated, and empowered, where dreams are created and realized.

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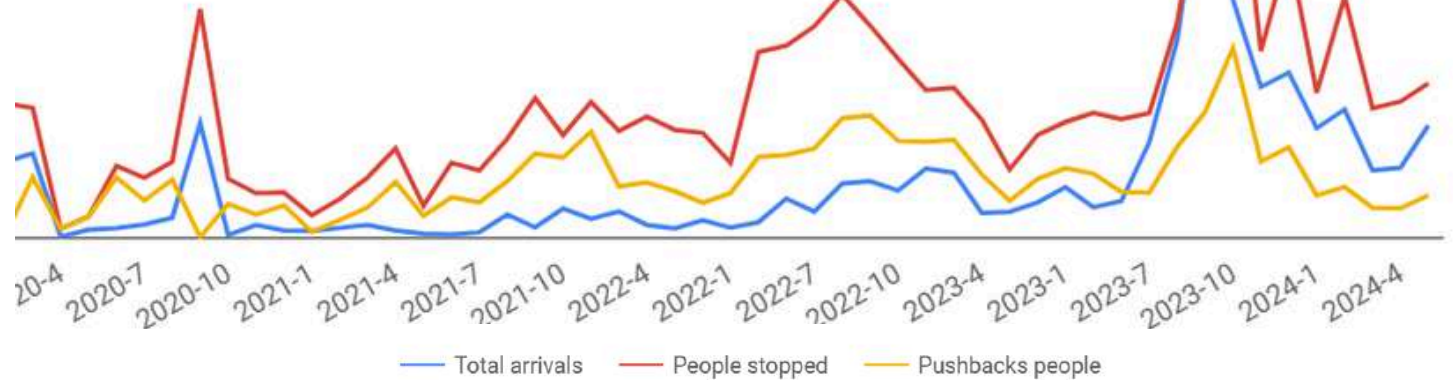


RENEWED SPIKE IN PUSHBACKS

EUROPEAN COMMISSION CONTINUES TO FINANCE PUSHBACKS IN GREECE

Since our last update in November, the forced pushbacks of men, women, and children seeking safety in Greece have surged to new heights, reminiscent of the massive spike in 2019 (Aegean Border Report Statistics). In 2024, people arriving is up 183%, compared to 2023. These reports underscore the inhumane and failing nature of Greece's asylum system. The Greek islands of Samos and Lesvos continue to see the highest numbers of illegal pushbacks and new arrivals. The urgency for humanitarian aid and support remains critical.

BRUTAL PROCEDURES CONTINUE

INHUMANE PRACTICES ON LAND AND ON SEA

Due to the difficult circumstances and the Taliban regime in Afghanistan, many Afghans are fleeing their homes. Refugees in camps in Turkey are often pushed back into Iran, and many of them are returned to Afghanistan, where they face brutal sanctions from the Taliban regime.

This practice by Turkey is illegal under both Turkish and international law. Therefore, Turkey is not a safe third country as the EU claims.

Those who manage to take a boat to Greece then have to fear pushbacks by the Turkish and Greek coast guards. Aegean Boat Report, an NGO, reports all these inhumane practices.

Aegean Boat Report states on their website:

"Everyone has the right to seek asylum and to escape war, cruelty, and chaos for a better life. These rights belong to all of us human beings. When they are attacked, we are all attacked."

Thanks to Aegean Boat Report and all the other NGOs for doing the work that the EU and other nations should be doing!

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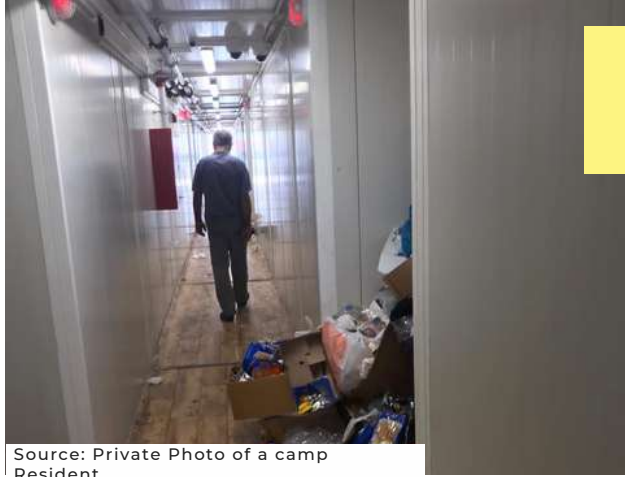
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DIRE LIVING CONDITIONS REMAIN

IN SAMOS' "STATE-OF-THE-ART" CAMP

Since last summer, Samos has seen a rise in refugee arrivals, coupled with a significant decrease in transfers to mainland structures, leading to severe overcrowding. Despite an overnight increase in the camp's nominal capacity from 2,040 to 3,659 people in late September, there have been no improvements to accommodate this surge. New arrivals report being forced to sleep on the floor without mattresses in spaces originally intended as dining areas. Even unaccompanied minors are left in communal areas amid dropping temperatures.

In November 2023, some refugees resorted to makeshift shelters in the camp's courtyards due to a lack of proper accommodation. Furthermore, the camp fails to meet basic international standards for water and sanitation, with severe shortages affecting both residents and staff, worsening already dire sanitary conditions. Overcrowding has led to long queues for food and a critical lack of essential goods like hygiene items, clothing, and shoes.

Now in the actual heatwave of the summer the most vulnerable people are not protected enough from the harsh weather conditions. Often the bus to the city of Vathy, where people need to go for appointments, is not operating properly. This especially is a problem when people have to get back to the camp on foot (2 hours). They are provided with 3 liters of drinking water in total, which in the heat of the summer is not enough. There were reports of people fainting due to these circumstances.

In the span of just three years, from April 2021 to December 2023, the SKILLS FACTORY on Samos evolved from a humble idea into a thriving community hub. What started as a dream quickly grew into a safe, creative and noisy space with over 10 diverse departments and up to 50 passionate volunteers. This journey was filled with learning, defining roles, and gaining invaluable experiences that shaped our path forward.

Inspired by success and lessons learned, we decided to move to a new location, with the goal of streamlining our operations and sharpening our focus. By reducing the number of departments, we can focus on what truly matters: quality, production, training, and building stronger connections.

Our new direction is all about offering a more focused and impactful experience. We have developed a non-formal, three-tiered training program open to everyone wanting to boost their skills and confidence. Additionally, we have redefined roles and brought more local paid staff on board to ensure continuity, sustainability, and a deeper community integration.

After three intense months of moving and renovating, SKILLS FACTORY 2.0 opened its doors in March! The later opening day was a heartwarming celebration filled with music, laughter, and joy. Our NGO partners, the local community, dedicated volunteers, and their loved ones all came together to mark this new beginning. It was a day of connection, celebration, and a shared vision for the future. We're excited for what's to come and grateful for everyone who has been part of this incredible journey.

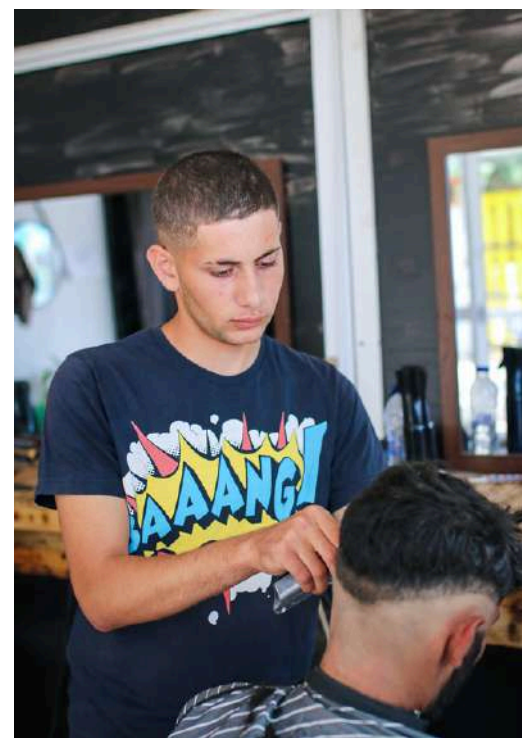
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KITCHEN DEPARTMENT

FOOD IS READY

Each day, our international team has been cooking a variety of dishes from around the world, like Greek zucchini fritters, Italian pasta, and Arabic stews with rice — our kitchen is a vibrant melting pot of cultures. Each dish we make reflects the rich diversity and shared experiences of our team and community.

A special highlight was our Eid Al-Adha celebration, where we hosted a big feast with BBQ chicken, salads, and desserts, bringing the community together in joy.

We continue to buy seasonal products, supporting local farmers and ensuring our meals are fresh, nutritious, and eco-friendly.

We're also proud to announce that two of our community volunteers have completed our "Level 1 - Kitchen Basics" course. They have acquired new cooking skills and grown in confidence over the past month. At SKILLS FACTORY, food is not just about eating; it's about celebrating culture, community, and connection.

Over the past six years, he has dedicated himself to humanitarian efforts across the Balkans, gaining extensive experience in culinary roles. Luca has cooked for large-scale projects, producing up to 1,200 meals daily while focusing on food waste reduction. He believes that **"Food is so special, it transcends borders and brings us all together."**

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SEWING DEPARTMENT

LEARNING, TEACHING, PRODUCING



In the department I proudly coordinate, there have been significant changes. At the old SKILLS FACTORY, we used household machines that were far too fragile for our needs and caused numerous problems. Now, at SKILLS FACTORY 2.0, we've invested in professional-grade machines to ramp up our clothing production and repair for the camp's residents.

We've recently equipped our revamped sewing department with three top-notch machines, identical to those used in professional factories. I'm thrilled about this upgrade — it's not only boosted our productivity but also improved the quality of the clothes we produce.

We sourced high-quality fabric from Thessaloniki, produced under fair working conditions, to further our commitment to ethics.

Our primary focus is on addressing the immediate needs of the camp's people, who often arrive with nothing more than the clothes on their backs. A particularly acute need is underwear, a basic necessity that many cannot afford. Our goal is to churn out vast quantities of underwear and establish partnerships with other NGOs for distribution.

I'm proud to report that we've already produced 200 pieces of underwear in various sizes.

Another task and passion of mine is teaching sewing skills to our community volunteers. Believe it or not, one can learn to sew in just a month! Despite the hardships they face, this training is an opportunity for them to build a brighter future. Once they obtain their refugee status, we assist in job placements in Athens or elsewhere in Greece. Our efforts have been fruitful, as the majority, if not all, find employment post-Samos.

However, a pressing concern remains the lack of warm clothing during the cold, windy winter months. I've seen too many people shivering in thin jumpers because they can't afford anything warmer. At SKILLS FACTORY, we feel a deep responsibility to address this. But to truly make a difference, we need more support from those who believe in a better world. The more donations we receive, the more materials we can buy to keep our people warm and comfortable.

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WASH-PROJECT

OUR RESPONSE TO THE WATER CRISIS



Since the opening of the Closed Controlled Access Center (CCAC) in 2021, the camp has grappled with challenges in maintaining an adequate water supply. Regular shutdowns and restrictions on water access, combined with a population double the intended capacity, led to the closure of laundry services, inaccessible showers, and a lack of proper hygiene. Consequently, various skin diseases, such as scabies, became widespread.

For over a year, the laundry facilities have not been in operation inside the CCAC.

In response to this catastrophic water crisis since beginning of 2023, our community advocated for expanded hygiene services in the new SKILLS FACTORY 2.0, leading to the establishment of the WASH-project. Funded by forRefugees, we were able to upgrade our laundry services to a new level with renovations, new machinery, and sustainability measures. Through this initiative we can provide a clean, friendly, and safe place for laundry service and personal hygiene while individuals can maintain their dignity, health and sense of humanity, even when water is scarce.

Since the opening of our WASH-project we are able to provide laundry and drying services for up to 20 residents of the Samos refugee camp everyday while collaborating with the medical organisations for health promotion and any emergency treatments and workshops.

Since the reopening of SKILLS FACTORY 2.0 in March 2024, our team has successfully completed

320 loads of laundry

providing clean clothes and a sense of dignity to the community (as of 25th June 2024)

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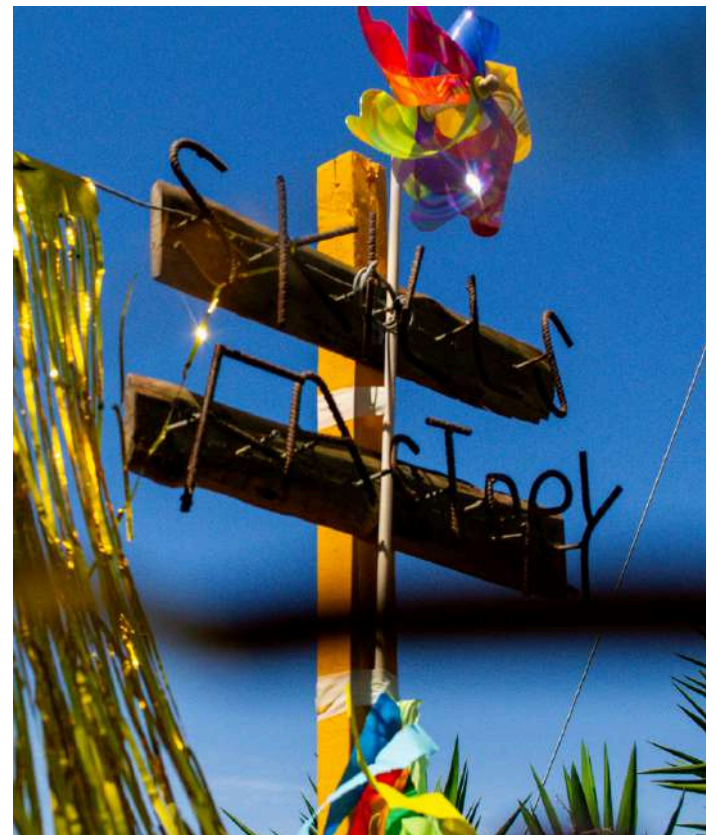
OPENING PARTY

SKILLS X SAMOS

MUSTAFA'S STORY

Hello, I'm Mustafa, 32 years old from Palestine. My life in Gaza was incredibly tough. With no work and constant wars, it felt like there was no future for me there. Seeking a better life, I traveled through Egypt and Turkey, facing many challenges and discrimination. After several attempts, I finally made it to Samos and stayed in the refugee camp for seven months. In the camp, I learned about SKILLS FACTORY from a friend and eventually joined their kitchen team to improve my cooking skills. It felt like a family, bringing me happiness and a sense of purpose.

Through the SKILLS FACTORY, I found a job at Fyllo Fyllo, a local restaurant. At first, I learned how to cook Greek food. Then, I asked my boss if I could try making Arabic food. We did a test and the Greek customers loved it. Soon, we started offering Arabic dishes once a week. Now, we offer Arabic food regularly and we even get orders for delivery, and it has become very popular.

My dream is to open my own restaurant here in Samos called "Skills," in honor of SKILLS FACTORY, which changed my life. They gave me a chance to prove myself and supported me every step of the way. I hope they continue to support all refugees like they did for me. My journey started here in Samos and I believe my future will grow from this point.

Inspired by the experiences of people on the move, our external volunteers created new unique pieces, adding a fresh touch to our collection. With each piece, we're breaking down barriers for asylum seekers, ensuring they can navigate their process without financial barriers.

“Free Palestine”

Philippa has drawn inspiration from the situation in Gaza, the blue sky, the sea, and the island vibe to create the design named "Free Palestine." This artwork features a sailboat with the Palestinian flag, symbolizing the journey towards freedom.

“Peace is a vibration we feel”

Ellora found inspiration in the people involved in our project, resulting in her piece titled "Peace is a Vibration We Feel." She shares her thoughts on the art: "Peace isn't a physical circumstance or something we agree upon, though it might be reflected in our physical circumstances. It is easy to realize yourself: enter any experience of conflict, take all the people out and immediately, it's self-evident — peace. It was always there, always is, always will be. Peace is not something humans manufacture or 'do'; rather, it's part of creation. Peace is a vibration we feel."

“Leave no one behind”

Lastly, we present Liv's design, "Leave No One Behind." The phrase was inspired by graffiti on the wall at Gagou Beach in Samos. The image of a flock of birds flying over a barbed wire fence was influenced by a conversation with Ellora and her belief that nature holds the answers and the sight of birds sticking together resonated with this message.

WINNER OF THE UNHCR AWARD

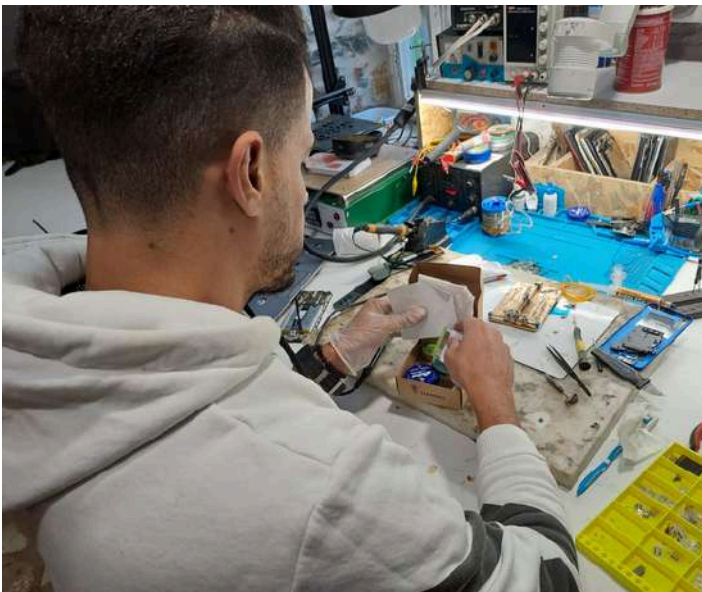
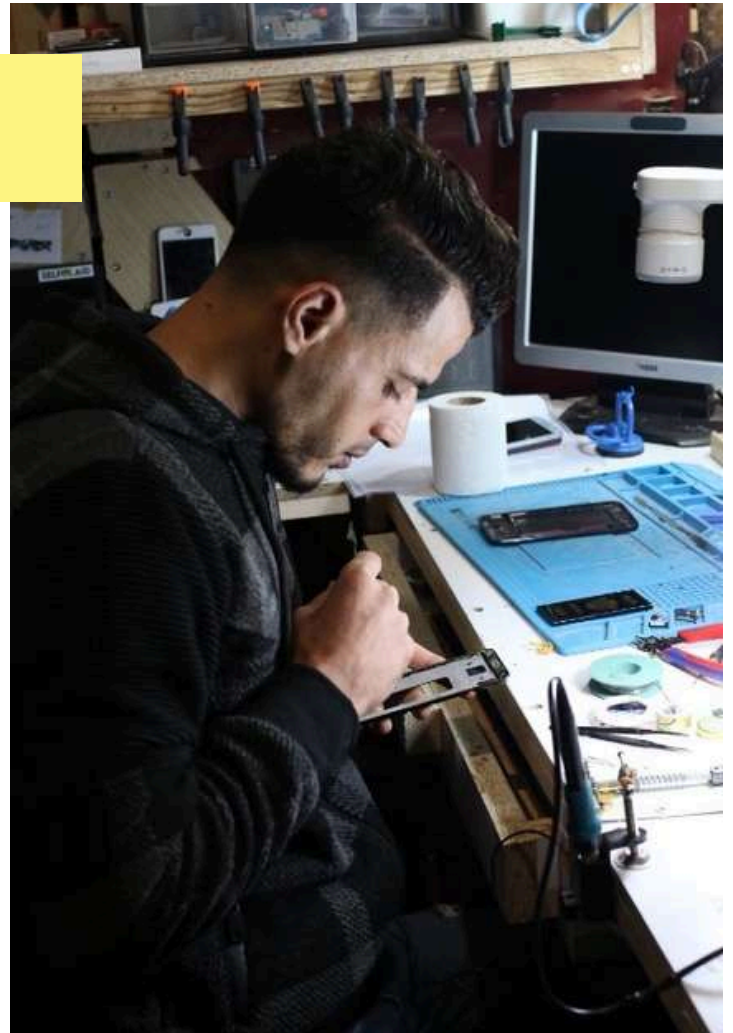
In December 2023, the Phones without Borders (PWB) project, led by our coordinator Mohammed, won the UNHCR Refugee-led Innovation Fund!

This award recognized the PWB project as one of 27 outstanding initiatives selected from over 3,300 submissions, earning additional funding and technical assistance to further develop its innovative concept.

As a result, in 2024 and 2025, the PWB project will undergo significant expansion. This includes establishing a new, larger workshop with improved lighting, forming a transnational team to collect phones across Central Europe, and developing networks with partner organizations on various islands. The project will distribute repaired phones through these partner organizations and provide vocational training, enhancing both the reach and impact of this initiative.

Due to this fund, we can guarantee to receive broken phones on a daily basis from individuals residing in the Samos refugee camp for checks, repairs or exchanges in the next two years, ensuring that community members can effectively communicate with authorities and family.
